Norman's Story

Now a proud husband, father of three girls, and an attorney with a private law practice, the organization's founder, Norman A. Yatooma, endured a devastating tragedy on March 11, 1993 when he learned that his father, Manuel S. Yatooma, had been murdered. Norman, at age 20, felt ill-equipped to fill his father's enormous shoes. Sixty-three claims were filed against Norman's father's estate. What little the creditors and litigants didn't take was spent on attorney fees. Before starting law school, Norman settled his first case, filed by members of his own family. It was truly heartbreaking.

And so it went: Rapid was the spiral from financial security to monetary chaos. Overnight his family went from relative wealth to threatened foreclosure, bankruptcy and dependence on social security. Without regular income, the Yatoomas were forced to squeeze out what they could from their school loans and side jobs to help keep food in the kitchen. In addition to wrestling with the trauma of their grief, his family was completely overwhelmed and unprepared to carry on in his father's absence. They desperately needed help.

Unfortunately, when Norman lost his father there was no organization like ours to provide his family with muchneeded support. Now, we are able to assist those trying to rebuild their lives after the loss of a parent. Founded in his name and memory, ten years after Manuel S. Yatooma's death, Yatooma's Foundation For The Kids was launched on Father's Day 2003 and has grown to help replace the void left by the loss of one or both parents. This organization is truly unique. Though many wonderful charities help children, no other charity has tailored their assistance to this specific group of children: children who hugged their parents one day and had to bury them the next.

Norman wishes to grow this charity to help thousands and perhaps millions of other children and their families while honoring the legacy of his cherished father. We cannot replace a lost parent. No one can. But we are committed to doing all that we can for these kids.
